



Welcome! I am pleased to welcome you and your parents to Biology 1A here at Eleanor Roosevelt High School! My name is Ms. Palma and I am looking forward to a great year with you. To make this an enjoyable and successful year, we must work together as a team: student, parents and teacher.



Course Description: During the first semester we will be studying Ecology, Biochemistry, Cell Biology, and Homeostasis. Second semester, we will study Genetics, Physiology, Bacteria, Viruses and Evolution. The class will include oral work, cooperative group work, written work, numerous projects, laboratory exercises, web based activities/assignments, quizzes and tests. Honors will also complete a mandatory research/persuasive essay.

Class expectations:

- RESPECT--Students will be courteous to the teacher, other students and to themselves. Swearing, disrespect, and cyber bullying will not be tolerated.
- Students will do their best to complete **ALL** class work, keep up with all assignments, **including computer based assignments**, and study for tests and quizzes.

Two of many helpful ways to express your thoughts and ideas.





Smart Phone or Tablet:

Grades

Grades are accessible 24/7 via internet through the Q grading system.



Cell Phone Policy:

Cell phones/tablets/lpods are invaluable tools in this class! Cell phones will be out and used during class time, but for instructional purposes only. Students using cell phones and other devices for personal use will be subject to classroom consequences



Homework Policy

Homework will be assigned everyday. The only exception may be on the night after a test.



Late Work Policy

I expect work to be done on time! However, I know life can get busy and this is only one of six classes being taken. Students may turn in 3 late assignments per quarter with 5% per day penalty for one week. All other late work drops to 50% and must be turned in by the end of the quarter. Zeros are not an option!



Technology Policy

activities on our class website. The website contains a daily agenda, homework, handouts/worksheets, notes, and other important class information.


*The website is used daily and all students should have access to it. The web address is:

QR Reader

QR Codes will be found on projects, homework, in class assignments and much more. This app will be needed to complete those assignments.



The **edmodo** app will be used with the edmodo website to turn in projects, complete assignments, watch videos and communicate with teachers and peers.



PicCollage

This app will help students create visual representations of their thoughts, questions and answers.



Nearpod

This tool will allow students fully engage in lectures.

Classroom Rules

Honors means distinguished academic excellence! In honors, students are expected to give and do more to earn the distinction of honors, and their grades should demonstrate student dedication and willingness to participate in an honors class. Therefore, students who receive grades lower than a 79% C on tests will be required to attend a tutoring session/intervention about the topic and/or write a 1 page report. This will help get students back on track so they do not fall behind. Failure to comply will result in a detention. Projects are also expected to demonstrate high effort and may be subject to resubmission.
